Craigsville-Goshen 115 kV Electric Transmission Partial Rebuild Project

AT DOMINION ENERGY, we are committed to providing the latest information on projects in the communities we serve. You are receiving this postcard because we have rescheduled the Craigsville-Goshen 115 kV Electric Transmission Partial Rebuild Project in Augusta and Rockbridge counties.

As you may recall from previous postcards, this project involves rebuilding a portion of an aging 115 kilovolt (kV) electric transmission line to current standards. This transmission line has provided reliable service for nearly a century, and stretches 11 miles from Craigsville Substation on Church Street in Augusta County to Goshen Substation on North Fork Lane in Rockbridge County. Originally, we expected to begin construction in summer 2023, but construction has been rescheduled due to ongoing analysis of infrastructure needs across our system. Now, we tentatively plan to begin construction on this project in 2026.

The decision to reschedule this project will not impact the quality of your electric service, and the existing infrastructure remains safe and secure. We will continue to monitor the bulk electric grid and complete projects to address community power needs, aging assets, and economic development.

We will continue to update you as this project progresses over the coming years.
