
IMPORTANT NOTICE:

Recent legislation has changed the eligibility threshold for participation in energy efficiency programs for non-residential customers.

On July 1, 2018, the Grid Transformation and Security Act (SB 966), a new Virginia law, will go into effect. The law exempts non-residential customers with a monthly electrical demand greater than 500 kW from paying Bill Rider C2-A, which funds energy efficiency programs. The current exemption threshold is 10 MW.

As a result of the new legislation, non-residential customers with a monthly demand greater than 500 kW will not be eligible to participate in energy efficiency projects after June 30, 2018. This demand threshold will be applied to individual customer accounts.

In order to transition to the new exemption requirement, Dominion Energy will allow affected non-residential customers to submit requests for initial assessments for rebate projects by June 1, 2018. Projects submitted by June 1, 2018 will receive initial assessments by June 30, 2018, and, if compliant with the standards of the applicable program, the project will receive authorization to proceed. The actual installation of the energy efficiency measures must be completed no later than September 30, 2018 and an application for rebate submitted no later than November 14, 2018. (These dates are summarized below.)

Note: The Small Business Improvement Program will be unaffected since only customers with electrical demand below 100 kW are eligible for this program.
